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IMPORTANT STUFF

GATES

PLEASE keep any gates shut at all times as you are now in the kingdom of livestock who love nothing better than getting out and having a nibble of things they shouldn't! Livestock can cause serious car accidents, or damage woodland or themselves if they escape their fields. Always make sure that you shut gates properly and secure them once you have passed through.

OUR YOUNGEST GUESTS

If you are bringing youngsters to Racquety Farm please make sure that they are safe and that you know where they are playing. We appreciate that many children do not get the opportunity to play in an unstructured environment every day and although we really hope to offer young people and children the chance to engage with the natural world positively, there are good reasons to ask that visiting children are not allowed un-supervised access to any of the woodland areas or the river banks. Our main concerns relate to minimising any potential damage to trees, plant life, animal life and rare species that have been identified at Racquety Farm as well as an equal concern for the safety of visitors at all times.

For this reason we politely ask that children have a responsible person accompanying them at all times and that all visitors, of whatever age, stick to the areas designated as accessible.

ACCESS

Where a notice says PRIVATE or NO ENTRY PLEASE or similar it is to protect, conserve and nurture the wildlife and countryside as well as keep visitors safe.

The accessible areas are spacious and there are good public footpaths with access to the River Wye running adjacent to the farm in easy walking distance. Please use them and enjoy them - they are beautiful.

Particular recommendations are for The Warren, a 20 minute walk from the farm along a woodland path accessed from just the other side of Hay Bridge. The Warren is a favourite picnic and play area with a beautiful river beach - ideal for skimming stones, paddling and many use it for swimming.







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MOBILE RECEPTION

Hay on Wye is pretty good for 4G coverage so if the wifi is being a bit slow try switching to 4G on your devices where possible.

APPLIANCES

- Larchwood Shower-Block There is underfloor heating throughout which (unless it's warm and/or summer) will be set before you get here so it is always nice and warm.
- Larchwood Shower-Block The water and heating is heated by a wood fired boiler system using wood from the farm alongside solar panels for this reason the water is never piping red-hot but it's the most sustainable shower you've ever had!
- Small camping shower units and kitchenettes on the field water is heated small gas fired boilers so the water is nice and hot in these units!
- Laundry –if you would like any laundry done Clare will happily oblige for a small fee, just give us a call! Alternately there is a launderette in Hay on Bell Bank Road near the main carpark.
- Please use the wash-stands/sinks on the camping field for washing-up not the shower-block

DOGS

We love dogs! We hope your dog/dogs enjoy their stay here – it really is a wonderful area for walks.

We have just a few requests:

- Please do not leave your dog unattended in your tent/vehicle or anywhere on the farm
- Please don't bring your dog into the woodland and toilet block area
- Dogs must be on a lead <u>at all times</u>

When outdoors on the farm please supervise your dog at all times:

• Dogs must not be simply 'put out' of the door to do their business. Your dog can cause mayhem easily by chasing wildlife and damaging habitat or nesting sites.

We have two resident dogs, Guinness the Jack-Russell Terrier who is generally with Ros and Morgan the Cocker Spaniel who is generally with Clare, both of whom woof a lot but are otherwise big softies! Please let us know if your dog(s) have issues with other dogs and we can







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either have an organised meeting to help them make friends or we can try to ensure our dogs and any other visiting dogs don't disturb you.

RUBBISH & RECYCLING

Across the farm as a whole we encourage a 'leave no trace' approach so please only use the landfill as a last resort, wash and sort all recyclables and pop all food waste in the caddy provided. If you're not sure please ask! All the different bins are in the camping fields by the wash stands and dotted around in other useful places – if you're not sure please ask us, we'd rather help and get it right than rummage around in the bins after you've gone ©







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FISHING

Our fishery, called Wyecliff Fishery, constitutes two thirds of a mile of left bank fishing directly above Hay-on-Wye, Wyecliff directly overlooks the fishery so it couldn't be more convenient. This beat offers some excellent trout fishing throughout its length, particularly on the upper part of the beat. There is also good opportunities for a salmon below the weir and anywhere along the sweeping left hand bend before the river approaches Hay bridge. The coarse fishing is also excellent with specimen barbel and chub present as well as some big pike. Wading is of mixed difficulty and studded soles are essential, especially for the upper, bedrock-dominated section. For the lower sections, the river flows over gravel and is much easier-going.

Rules and Regulations

- EAW bye-laws must be observed and it is up to anglers to familiarise themselves with these
- Catch & release for all species
- Dogs allowed but must be kept under control at all times
- This Beat operates a Wash-Off Policy
- Current Coarse Fishing Regulations must be adhered to at all times

FOOD & SHOPPING

Nearest pint of milk – A two-minute drive/bicycle or a lovely fifteen-minute stroll into Hay on Wye town centre. Either use the river path and pick up the road or head down the drive, turn right, over the bridge, turn right and you're in Hay! Hay has heaps of independent shops, for essentials head to Pughs @ Londis in the centre, Hay Deli on Lion Street or Spa on Castle Street.







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We have one supermarket which is over the bridge and turn left, it's a Co-Op and although not enormous it has plenty of everything one expects from a supermarket.

Castle Greengrocers is great for local produce, fruit, veg and wine!

Hay has two independent Butchers, Gibbons on Castle Street and Small Farms on Broad Street (which sells mainly organic meat and produce). There's also an independent, family run chemist, two hardware shops, two florists, lots of bookshops (see below), lots of bric-a-brac and vintage shops and some good antique shops. There are excellent clothing stores plus a very swanky, traditional outfitters that is a must for browse.

Half-Day Closing: A few shops in Hay are CLOSED at mid-day on Tuesdays (mostly Grocery Shops and the Post Office).

MARKETS

We have a fantastic Thursday Market in Hay, 8am – 2pm. Stalls are dotted around the town offering a mixture of local produce, arts/crafts and antiques. There's a smaller foodie market on Saturday mornings in the undercover Cheese-market in the centre of Hay off Castle Street.

BOOKSHOPS

It wouldn't be Hay if we didn't talk about bookshops! At our last count there were 24 bookshops in Hay, there's a helpful, annual Booksellers leaflet including a map of which there should be copies of in the house.

EATING IN and OUT

Yum yum... it's foodie-heaven in Hay!

Quite often you don't even need to leave the farm to enjoy some great local grub. We have pop up food events right here at Larchwood Studio throughout the year featuring A Rule of Tum, Origin Pizza, Trigg Food Events famous Kebabs, El Cerdo Verde Tacos and Boca Loco – up and coming dates and details are posted on the website guest-book pages, our social media and on the info boards at Larchwood in the summer.







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Hay Hangry - our brand new Hay Delivery Service, a top bunch of youngsters eager to serve the people of Hay with convenient eats and treats – they deliver to you at the farm, just let them know your house name or pitch number when you order.

Origin Pizza - Nick and Bea need no introduction, just get a pizza, eat it, fall in love!

Both pizza places are FAB ... you can preorder and collect from their various locations or organise delivery through Hay Hangry or sometimes they make a special appearance at the farm.

The Old Electric Shop – Great coffee and superb 'free-from' options in the cake department... plus it's a must-visit department store (Hay-style) as well! Almost opposite the Clock Tower.

The Bean Box – Fantastic coffee by the river

Cosy Café – new and trendy, great juices and healthy options

Dog Friendly?

The Granary – Proper country-café, huge menu, open fires, outside seating, friendly faces. Opposite the Clock Tower.

It's also important to point out that nearly all the places on this list are dog friendly, at the very least by arrangement and at specific tables/seating areas. Thumbs up for dogs in Hay!
